## Market Commentary

### • Ericsson sues Apple for telecom patent infringement

Swedish mobile telecom gear maker Ericsson is suing Apple Inc for patent infringement after Apple refused Ericsson's offer to have a court determine fair licensing terms, Ericsson said.

### • After Indonesia retreat, GM retrenches in Thailand

A day after announcing it is to stop making GM-branded cars in Indonesia, General Motors said it would cease production of its Chevrolet Sonic in Thailand by the middle of this year.

### • T-Mobile U.S. CEO says makes sense to team up with dish

T-Mobile US chief executive said it made sense to team up with U.S. satellite TV company Dish.

### • China drops leading tech brands for certain state

China has dropped some of the world's leading technology brands from its approved state purchase lists, while approving thousands more locally made products, in what some say is a response to revelations of widespread Western cyber surveillance.

### • Chicago PMI reading falls far below expectations

A reading under 50 is bearish for the economy and it came in at 45.8, the lowest reading since 2009

### • US Consumer Sentiment eases

Came in at a reading of 95.4, down from 98.1 the previous month

**TSX** index opened slightly higher on the last trading day of the month as commodities and banks rose modestly . **U.S. stock index futures** saw a lower open as investors cautiously looked for growth and consumer sentiment data. Extended a two-month rally. **Oil** rebounded, with **Brent** heading for its first monthly gain since July, supported by strong inflows and improving demand outlook and supply outages. **Gold** was steady but has risen since the open but still headed for its biggest monthly loss since September.

• **Bombardier Inc** (BBDdb). The company confirmed on Thursday that it will begin long-delayed flight testing on Friday on the CS300 - the larger version of its new CSeries narrow-body jet. The first flight, which had been scheduled to take place on Thursday, had been called off earlier this week because of poor weather. The Montreal-based company is under pressure to bring the CSeries into service after years of delays and cost overruns.

## ANALYSTS' RECOMMENDATION

• **Maple Leaf Foods Inc** (MFI). CIBC raises price target to c\$23 from c\$21; rating sector performer as the company reported noisy fourth quarter results that are not terribly meaningful to the investment thesis.

• **Stantec Inc** (STN). CIBC cuts price target to c\$38 from c\$38.50 as the company reported a week fourth quarter results.
